NOTES AND NEWS

The New Wing at Tyndale House

The opening by Mr. J. W. Laing of the new wing at Tyndale House containing the new library and improved residential facilities, on April 21st. is a new landmark in the Fellowship's history for which it is fitting that we render thanks to God. More than 150 guests witnessed the unveiling of a plaque marking the dedication of the building to the glory of God alone for the furtherance of Christian scholarship. Two stout friends of the Fellowship since its inception, the Revd. A. M. Stibbs and the Revd. J. Stafford Wright, spoke at the meeting, and Professor Norman Anderson, a former Warden of Tyndale House, presided. After tea Mr. D. J. Wiseman gave a public lecture on the Babylonian texts illustrating Nebuchadrezzar's capture of Jerusalem, for the interpretation of which he has been largely responsible.
