NOTES AND NEWS

Recent Lectures at Tyndale House.

Four Tyndale Lectures were delivered at Tyndale House in the course of the summer study groups: Mr. K. A. Kitchen on 'The Joseph Narratives and their Egyptian background'; Mr. E. A. Judge on 'Social Obligation in the New Testament'; Professor Gwyn Walters on 'The Intercession of the Spirit'; and Professor G. C. B. Davies on 'Some Aspects of the life of Henry Ryder, the first Evangelical Bishop'. Dr. Davies's lecture was the first of the new series of Tyndale Historical Theology Lectures. Mr. Judge having been appointed to a lectureship in the University of Sydney during the past year, his lecture was read in his absence.

In addition to these, there have been two lectures this year under the auspices of the Friends of Tyndale House. The late Professor Arndt spoke on the Arndt-Gingrich Lexicon on the day of its publication: and on a recent visit the Rev.

Professor G. E. Ladd, of Fuller Theological Seminary, California, gave a much appreciated lecture on 'The place of Apocalyptic in Biblical religion'.

Annual Meeting of the Friends of Tyndale House.

The Annual Meeting was held on 29th June. Dr. D. R. Denman, presenting the report for the year, spoke of the development of the House as a research centre, and of the progress of the Tyndale House Development Fund, by which it has sought to clear the deficit on the new building and establish sources for the maintenance of the Library and for grants for post-graduate research. Dr. W. J. Martin spoke on the place of evangelical scholarship in Christian strategy today. Mr. D. J. Wiseman was in the Chair.

The Summer Study Groups.

The Old Testament, New Testament, and Biblical Theology groups all held their annual meetings in June and early July. In each case the group's activity centred on a particular theme: The Book of Jeremiah; the doctrine of the Holy Spirit; the Corinthian Correspondence. Members contributing related some aspect of their own studies to the theme of the Group.

The Winter Study Groups.

The Church History Group is to meet at Tyndale House from 17th to 20th December. Contributions are expected on a wide range of subjects in Christian history and historical theology.

The Puritan Studies Group is to meet at Westminster Chapel on 17th and 18th December under the chairmanship of Dr. D. Martyn Lloyd-Jones.

The late Dr. W. F. Arndt.

The sudden passing of Dr. William F. Arndt, which took place in February, was a sad blow to all members of the House. In the brief period in which he had been resident at Tyndale House, he had made a deep impression as a Christian scholar and a Christian gentleman.

Dr. Arndt was for many years Professor of New Testament Interpretation at Concordia Theological Seminary, and the author of several books: but he will be known to most members as the co-editor of the Arndt-Gingrich Lexicon of the Greek New Testament. This magnificent work, a translation and adaptation of the famous Lexicon of Walter Bauer, has become an almost indispensable tool for the study of the Greek New Testament. On the evening of its publication by the Cambridge University Press, Dr. Arndt gave a lecture under the auspices of the Friends of Tyndale House in which, after surveying the history of New Testament lexicography, he spoke of the origins and growth of the contribution to Biblical scholarship with which his name will be linked.
