WHEN THIS ISSUE appears, the Rev. and Mrs. Leon Morris will have arrived from Melbourne and taken up residence at Tyndale House. They are no strangers to Cambridge, for they were at the House during the period of Dr. Morris' postgraduate studies for his doctorate thesis. They are assured of a welcome from all connected with the House and in the Tyndale Fellowship.

The range of the new Warden's academic interests may be gauged from a brief review of his career. He graduated (B.Sc.) from the Science Faculty of the University of Sydney in 1934 and in 1937 supplemented this with the Th.L. (1st Class) of the Australian College of Theology. He was ordained in 1938 and served in the N.S.W. parish of Campsie and the S.A. parish of Minnipa. In 1943 he was placed in Class I in London B.D. and took his M.Th. in 1946. After postgraduate studies (1950-52) — when he was a member of Tyndale House — he received his Ph.D. (Cantab.) for work on a thesis, subsequently published in a modified form by the Tyndale Press under the title of *The Apostolic Preaching of the Cross* (1955). In 1945 he joined the Staff of Ridley College, Melbourne, as Vice Principal. Dr. Morris has recently spent a period of study leave (1960-61) teaching in Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, Georgia, and in Westminster Theological Seminary, Philadelphia and visiting other Colleges in New England and on the Atlantic and Pacific Coasts of U.S.A.
